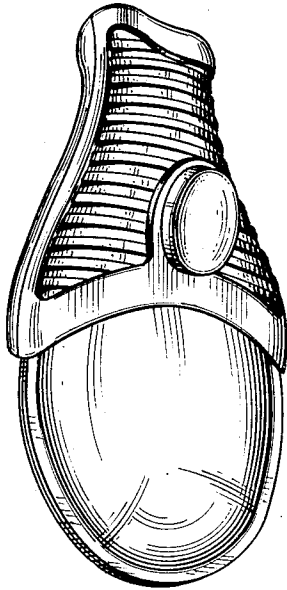

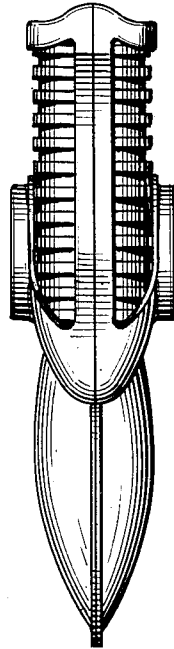
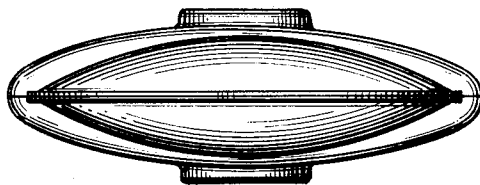

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Hal Horne, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Musical Instrument, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

In the drawing:

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a musical instrument, showing my new design;

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view thereof; and

Fig. 3 is a bottom plan view.
